### The Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012

#### Notice Issued under Regulation 5 (Procedures Prior to Private Meetings), regarding the procedures prior to private meetings

Regulation 5 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012 requires that a notice be published at least five clear days before any Cabinet meeting, where confidential or exempt information is to be considered in private (with the press and public excluded from the meeting).

This is in addition to the 28 clear days' notice given by the Cabinet Forward Plan, which was updated on 14 November 2017, giving details that the document(s) listed below are due to be considered in private.
