### The Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012

#### Notice Issued under Regulation 10 (General exception), regarding the Intention to take Key Decisions without 28 clear-days notice

Regulation 9 of the above Regulations requires 28 clear days notice to be given of all Key Decisions taken on behalf of the Council. Where that notice is impracticable, the decision can only be made where:

- the Chairman of the Improvement & Scrutiny Committee has been informed in writing – or, if there is no such person, each member of the relevant Overview and Scrutiny Committee by notice in writing, of the matter about which the decision is to be made;
- the Council has issued a Public Notice (i.e. this Notice), setting out the reasons why compliance with Regulation 9 is impracticable; and
- five clear days have elapsed following the issue of the Notice.

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Regulation 10 that the Cabinet intends to make the following key decisions without the 28 clear-days notice:

Transforming Building Control in Derbyshire	Cabinet, 8 April 2015	Public	The Council has to follow a process involving other local authorities and has limited time within which to conclude matters. There are no scheduled meetings of Cabinet prior to the meeting of Annual Council on 20th May. There will be unnecessary delay and the scheme may be prejudiced if the matter is deferred.
Central Headquarters	Cabinet, 8 April 2015	Private – as the report contains information relating to the financial and or business affairs of any particular person (including the authority holding that information) as set out in paragraph 3 of Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act 1972	For commercial reasons the Council needs to consider this matter further as soon as practicable. There are no scheduled meetings of Cabinet prior to the meeting of Annual Council on 20th May. There will be unnecessary delay and the scheme may be prejudiced if the matter is deferred.
